## Auto crash takes life of BHS senior

Michael Allen Cummings, a 17-year-old Burlington high school senior, died early Saturday at University hospitals, Iowa

City, of apparent head injuries received in a one-car crash in Burlington Friday night.

Cummings, son of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Cummings, 1515 Remey, was southbound on Main about 9:30 p.m. when his 1962 Volkswagen went out of control, struck a

utility pole guy wire and landed on its top about 20 feet from the Main-South street intersection. Firemen, police and ambulance attend-

ants took about 10 minutes to pry the youth from the demolished vehicle. The youth was taken by ambulance

to Burlington's Memorial hospital and later transferred to University hospitals. lowa City, where he died at 2:30 a.m. There were no witnesses to the accident.

However, the youth's parents told police that their son, a diabetic, had had a history of insulin reaction. The youth was a member of the First

United Presbyterian church, YMCA, Boy Scout Troop 25, Order of the Arrow, a recipient of the Scouting God and Country award, and worked at Younkers in Fairway Center. He had gotten off work shortly before the

accident.
