Roger G. Waterhouse

Roger Guy Waterhouse, 22, of 1419 S. Central, was found dead in a pickup at S. Ninth and Walnut Saturday morning, Nov. 27, the apparent victim of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

Burlington police responding to an 11:46 a.m. call found Waterhouse in a pickup owned by David Smith, 1101 S. Ninth. The truck was not running, but the ignition switch was on and the CB radio working, police said. Death was attributed to a .22-caliber rifle wound to the head, police said; the rifle was found in the truck. Officers estimated time of death about 7 a.m.

Waterhouse was born May 8, 1954, in Burlington, the son of John and Mary Murphy Waterhouse. He was an Army veteran of the Vietnam war.
